

Dance to Your Daddy

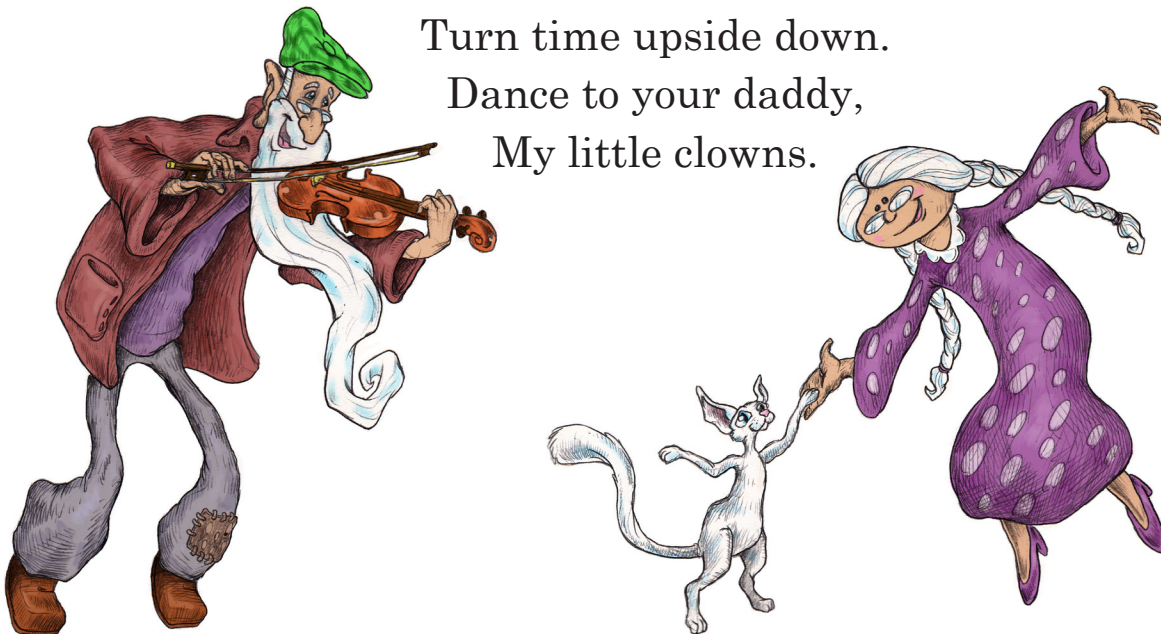
Phineas's Fiddle and Fife Song*
